MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS: New Horizons is very excited to put our new bus into service. As a reminder, the New Horizons Transit Authority provides transportation to medical appointments every Tuesday and Thursday. This service is open to New Horizons residents and to Meadows residents who are enrolled in the transportation program. Departing from the New Horizons lobby, the bus travels to Marlborough, Hudson, Sudbury, Framingham, Southborough, Northborough, and Concord. (Please note: Transportation to Concord is limited to Thursdays only, between noon and 4:00 PM.) To reserve a seat:

- Call the Front Desk at #0, and provide the date, time, location, contact information, and expected duration of your appointment.
- Appointments must be scheduled between 8:00 AM and 10:30 AM on Tuesdays and 8:00 AM and 2:00 PM on Thursdays to accommodate both depature and pick-up times.
- All reservations should be made **by 4:00 PM on Monday** for *Tuesday* appointments and **4:00 PM on Wednesday** for *Thursday* appointments.
- Residents will be contacted individually to confirm scheduled departure times.

Residents are requested to be in the main lobby of New Horizons 10 minutes prior to departure. Please keep in mind that the bus takes residents to a variety of destinations. For this reason, the bus must leave *on time* and will occasionally drop off residents earlier than their scheduled appointment. As appointments conclude, the bus will shuttle back to pick up residents returning to New Horizons.
